

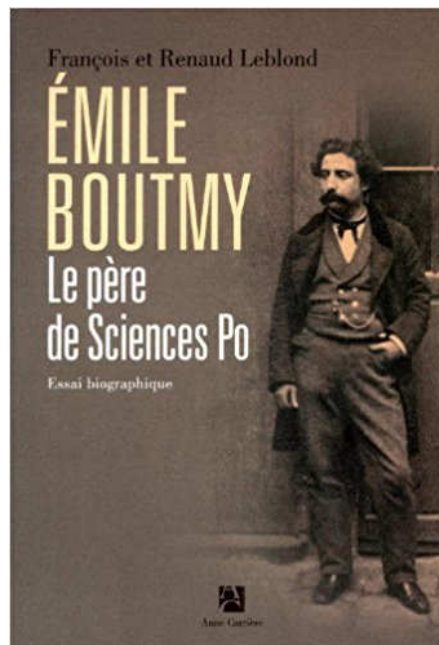

- **Sciences Po's educational project** aims to educate responsible citizens and active members of the social and professional community whether they envision a career in the private sector, the highest levels of government or academia.



## Training Global Citizens: But how?

### 2. Civic Responsibility in a Multidisciplinary Curriculum: The Core Objectives are Reaffirmed

- **Multidisciplinary approach:** Social sciences as core to understand the complexity of the world  
1<sup>st</sup> year in Economics, History, Law, Sociology & Political Science  
2<sup>nd</sup> year in International Relations & concentration in Economics, History or Law
- **Two working languages:** French & English
- **Compulsory 3rd year abroad**
- **Diversity:** socio-economic (CEP) & international: we recruit the best talents from around the world (50% of our students are international)
- **Civic engagement:** students' civic engagement are mandatory and are validated with credits
- **Admissions (19%) & students' civic engagement:** the fact of being socially engaged is highly valued.
- **Developing civic skills and attitudes through leadership, creativity and project initiatives within the curriculum** (Field Internship, Arts Workshops, Group Projects, Simulations) **and in the extracurricular context** (Student Associations, Student Unions, Tutoring/Mentoring, The Sciences Po Incubator).
- **«Flipped classrooms»:** students are placed at the center & as key drivers of their education
